This report to the legislature was another requirement of LD1911 (An Act to Prevent the Further Contamination of the Soils and Waters of the State with So-called Forever Chemicals) which became law in 2022.

NEBRA Submits Comments on Quebec Proposal to Ban U.S. Biosolids

On April 8th, NEBRA submitted comments to the Ministère de l'Environnement, de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques, de la Faune et des Parcs (MELCCFP) – Quebec's environmental regulators – regarding its proposed regulatory amendment to ban imports of U.S. biosolids for use in direct agricultural application. NEBRA's comments were focused on the benefits of recycling and the risks of not land applying biosolids and residuals. MELCCFP has issued a temporary moratorium on the import of U.S. biosolids and has published an update to its guide for recycling residuals or "matières résiduelles fertilisantes" (MRF). The updates to the <u>Guide</u> will remain in effect until control measures are in place. See NEBRA's letter on the Reg-Leg Committee <u>webpage</u>.

Please contact your elected official and let them know how CERCLA liability will affect your facility or business.
